Denotation and Connotation Teaching A word's denotation is its dictionary definition. A word can also make people feel or think a certain way. These feelings and ideas are the connotations of a word. Words with the same meaning can have different "shades of meaning"—that is, they can be understood differently. Positive connotation: Being on the track team has made Alan slender and lean.
