The Michigan Medicaid State Plan is an agreement between the state and federal government that identifies the general health care services, reimbursement, and eligibility policies in effect under Michigan Medicaid. It is the basis for the federal government (CMS/HHS) to pay its federal financial participation (FFP) for the program's operation.

Medicaid is a wide-ranging, jointly funded state and federal health care program for low-income families and individuals of all ages.

Michigan's plan was to have individuals at that point either switch to a QHP through the exchange (subsidized with Medicaid funds), or remain in the Healthy Michigan Plan but with cost-sharing of up to 7 percent of income (with an opportunity to reduce the cost-sharing by participating in various healthy behaviors).

Michigan operates a state-based Medigap subsidy program for Medicare beneficiaries with modest income (no more than 225 percent of the poverty level) who purchase Medigap plans from one of five participating Medigap insurers in the state. This subsidy program is expected to continue until 2021, or when funding is exhausted.
