Obstetrical Providers Reimbursed for Immediate Postpartum Contraception

The New York State Department of Health issued a Medicaid policy change which allows health care providers to be reimbursed when intrauterine devices (IUDs) and contraceptive implants are offered and chosen immediately after childbirth.

Postpartum family planning aims to help women who have recently given birth select a contraceptive method that they

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want to use, voluntarily initiate its use and continue use for two years or longer, depending on the reproductive intentions of the woman or couple. 1 Family planning following childbirth is important not only to help women and couples achieve their reproductive intentions, but also to achieve broader maternal and child health outcomes.

Family planning (FP) is an essential component of health care provided during the antenatal period, immediately after delivery and during the first year postpartum (WHO 2009). Postpartum family planning (PPFP) is defined as the prevention of unintended pregnancy and closely spaced pregnancies through the first 12 months following childbirth.

Programming strategies for Postpartum Family Planning

The Family Planning Extension Program (FPEP) provides 24 months of family

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planning services for women who were pregnant while in receipt of Medicaid (regardless of how that pregnancy ended), but who are no longer eligible for Medicaid after their 60-day postpartum period. Women who are eligible for benefits through FPEP, are covered on the ...

Comprehensive Family Planning and Reproductive Health Care ...

Family planning services in the post-partum period, termed post-partum family planning (PPFP) is critical to cover the unmet need for contraception, especially when institutional delivery rates have increased. However, the intention to choose PPFP methods such as post-partum intrauterine devices (PPIUD) remains low in countries such as Nepal.

Postpartum family planning (PFPP) is of particular interest for the prevention of close and unwanted pregnancies during the first 12 months after childbirth. In typical maternal and newborn health programs, the postpartum period is defined as six weeks after birth, but in the context of PFP, this period refers to the first year after birth.
